Estimated Cost: Around \$500. This includes the YouthWorks fee per person (meals, activities, accommodations, etc.), van rental and insurance, fuel, overnight accommodations enroute, expenses while at our site, etc. Total cost is also affected by the number of participants, number of vans needed, the price of gas, and the amount of fundraising. This cost does not include four meals to Montana and back or spending money for the week.


Parental Authorization and **Code of Conduct** forms will be needed at a later date. For now, please read the general expectations and sign this form indicating you agree and will comply.
